Here are some fun facts about animals featured in Disney movies.

Raccoons:

Their name comes from the Powhattan word *aroughcun*, meaning "animal that scratches with its hands."

There are 10 different species of raccoons.

President Calvin Coolidge kept one in the White House as a pet.

Elephants:

They use their tusks to hunt prey.

Elephants have incredible long-term memories.

Baby elephants suck their trunks, like children suck their thumbs.

Mandrills:

Like humans, mandrills each have their own unique fingerprints.

The narrow set of their eyes makes them have poor eyesight.

The red and blue coloring on their faces and rumps becomes brighter when they get excited.

Lions:

Both male and female lions can roar. Their roars can be heard from up to 5 miles away.

Male lions' manes darken as they get older.

They are the fastest land mammals, traveling up to 60 miles per hour.

Tigers:

Like most cats, tigers do not like water.

The stripes on one side are not symmetrical to the stripes on their other side.

Tigers sometimes bury some of their kill and eat the leftovers for the next four or five days.

Alligators:

Alligators do not have vocal cords, but they can make a variety of calls by growling and hissing.

They can go through over 2,000 teeth during their lifetime.

They have only existed for the past few hundred years.

Hamsters:

They use cheek pouches to transport food, making their head appear to double or triple in size.

Hamsters like to live in family groups.

They are crepuscular, which means they are nocturnal and come out to eat at twilight.

Chameleons:

Chameleons change color to camouflage themselves from predators.

They are almost completely deaf – they do not even have ears!

They can move each of their eyes 180°, making them able to see 360° around them.

Foxes:

Males are called bulls and females are called cows.

Foxes live in small families called "leashes" or "skulks."

"What Does the Fox Say?" Foxes can make 40 different sounds, including a roar-like scream.

Dalmatian Dogs:

They are famous for being firehouse dogs.

Dalmatians are born with their spots.
